## What is Catch-Up Funding for?

The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds.

# **Funding Allocations**

School allocations will be calculated on a per pupil basis. The Observatory School will receive £240 for each place for the 2020/2021 academic year. Similar to pupil premium , the Department for Education states that 'schools should use the sum available to them as a single total even though funding is calculated on a per pupil place.

## Using Catch-Up Funding

School is using this funding for specific activities to support students to catch up for lost learning
