

## Key Stage 4 Religious Education

All students have the opportunity to consider some philosophical and ethical issues during Year 10 and 11.

These sessions are designed to engage the students in discussion and debate and encourage them to reflect on a range of viewpoints, both religious and secular. An overriding aim is to provide opportunities for personal reflection about a range of contemporary moral issues, whilst developing important transferable skills.

All pupils in key stage 4 have one lesson of RE per week.
