It is important that RE, although not a subject in the national curriculum, plays a full part in addressing these issues. RE is a core subject of the basic curriculum and is taught to all pupils who are not withdrawn by their parents, for the whole of their period of compulsory education.

The main aim of Religious Education is to encourage respect for all beliefs and cultures as well as helping to promote the pupils' spiritual, moral, physical and cultural development. The syllabus and work in our school is based on aspects of The Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education, which is adapted to meet the needs of the students within the school. The teaching of RE should also help pupils to learn about religion as well as learning from religion.
