THE STAND UP TO BULLYING DAY CAMPAIGN AIMS TO:

Raise public awareness about bullying and its long-term effect.

Create understanding about our collective role in tackling bullying.

Empower the public with the tools to stand up to bullying; wherever they are.

Stand Up To Bullying Day was started by The Diana Award in 2016, with the support of HRH The Duke of Cambridge in an effort to bring the country together and raise awareness as to what bullying is, how it occurs and what to do about it. Last year saw the campaign reach over three million people on social media alone. Help us beat that number and stand up for a community of kindness

Schools in England are legally required to have an anti-bullying policy and to share it with teachers, parents and pupils. This policy makes clear the approach the school takes to bullying, and ensures that the whole school community – from students who are being bullied or bullying others, to parents, governors and staff – are aware of the school's antibullying work and the steps that are taken if bullying is reported.

We believe that the best anti-bullying policies are created with a wholeschool approach, including students, teachers, SLT members, governors and parents.

Lunches are to be paid for in cash, this can be either passed to your Teacher, TA,



World Book Day is a registered Charity, working towards changing lives through a love of books and shared reading. Their mission is to promote reading for pleasure, offering every child and young person the opportunity to have a book of their own.

Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income. We want to see more children, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds, with a life-long habit of reading for pleasure and the improved life chances this brings them.

World Book Day was created by UNESCO on 23rd April 1995 as a worldwide celebration of books and reading. It is marked in over 100 countries around the globe.

The first World Book Day in the UK and Ireland took place in 1997 to encourage young people to discover the pleasure of reading.

As World Book Day founder, Baroness Gail Rebuck, recalls "We wanted to do something to reposition reading and our message is the same today as it was then – that reading is fun, relevant, accessible, exciting, and has the power to transform lives."

This year is the 25th year there's been a World Book Day, and on 3rd March 2022, children of all ages will come together to share the joy of reading for pleasure.

Spending just 10 minutes a day reading and sharing stories with children can make a crucial difference to their future success and it's fun for all involved.
